1 CORINTHIANS READING PLAN WEEK 3



Week 3 took us through Chapter 6 and 7. For our review, I will focus on some matters in chapter 6. Chapter 7 is not the easiest to review because there are a lot of tough matters to interpret. I am going to give you a link to Guzic's commentary. You would do well to check that out.

Chapter 6

- 1. Verses 1-11 What do you see as Paul's concern with Christians suing Christians?
- 2. Do you think Paul was saying Christians should never use the legal system? The answer is no. Paul used the legal system to plead his innocence in some matters.
- 3. Verses 9-11 are incredible. Look at the past of the people who made up much of the Corinthian church. Paul names so many sins. What is so wonderful about verse 11?
- 4. The working out of our salvation is continuous, in the sense that we are to live out our salvation in this world. In another sense, God views our salvation as complete we have been washed, sanctified, and justified. IT IS DONE! All of this is through Jesus.
- 5. Verse 12 "Everything is permissible to me but not everything is beneficial." That seems to have been a quote that Paul may have used when he was with the Corinthians to teach about Christian liberty in regard to things as food (you can eat what you want), special days (Jews who were saved are not obligated to keep Jewish 'holy' days), etc. What does it appear that the Corinthians did with that principle in regard to sexual behavior?

6. Verse 19 - why is what we do with our body important to our faith?
