2 CORINTHIANS READING PLAN WEEK 10



Week 10 is complete. We covered chapters 6-8. I pray you are learning much from the church of Corinth. Let's review.

Chapter 6

- 1. According to verses 1-2, when is the best day for a lost person to be saved? Why?
- 2. Recall, there were those in the church of Corinth who questioned Paul's integrity. What does Paul appeal to in vv.3-12?
- 3. Vv.14-18 is a call to live lives that are distinguished from the world. The call is for believers to not be joined with unbelievers. This is not saying do not have anything to do with unbelievers. If that was the case, how would we ever share the gospel. The issue is the believer is not to fall into sins of unbelievers. We are to be the ones influencing. However, there are areas believers and unbelievers should not be joined. What would you say are primary areas believers and unbelievers should not be joined?

Chapter 7

1. This chapter begins with Paul speaking positively about the church. What do you see as encouragement he gave?

2.	Paul sought to rise above the accusations about him by some in the church. He had to be stern with them at points, and he knew when to be encouraging. How is this balance needed in our relationships?
3.	V.8-9 - here is a brief mention of the painful letter he sent to the church that we do know have a copy of. The letter was a stern letter calling for repentance by those who had grievously sinned. Paul states that he regretted having to send it; he then says but on the other hand he did not regret it. How can both be?
4.	What is the difference between Godly sorrow(grief) and worldly sorrow(grief)?
<u>Chapter 8</u>	
Chapter 8 centers around a 'famine' relief offering for the Christians in Jerusalem. The churches of Greece had promised to send an offering to help them. Corinth was in southern Greece called Achaia. The northern part of Greece was Macedonia. Macedonia included the churches of Philippi, Thessalonica and Berea. The Macedonian churches had fulfilled their promise. The church of Corinth had promised to send an offering, yet, after a year had not done this.	
1.	What amazed Paul about the giving of the Macedonian churches?
2.	Verse 7 - what are areas to excel in?
3.	Verse 9 - what is the great example of giving?
4.	Titus is not the most well-known person in the Bible. However, he played a vital role. What strengths do you see Paul highlighting about Titus?
