Easter Week Readings



This week we turned our focus upon readings surrounding the week of Jesus' sufferings. We will resume Judges on Monday. Let us look into several passages about our Lord's sacrifice of Himself for God's glory and our sinful state.

Isaiah 52:13-53:12

This prophecy of the "Suffering Servant" describes in vivid detail what happened to Jesus. Written several hundred years before Jesus was born, it is a remarkable description of Jesus' life.

- 1. In these verses what does the Lord through Isaiah make very plain about the physical appearance of the Messiah? (53:2)
- 2. What stands out to you as these verses describe the horrendous sufferings of Jesus?
- 3. V.10 Why did it please the Lord to crush the Servant severely? What was accomplished?
- 4. V. 9 How was Jesus with the wicked in HIs death, and with a rich man at his burial?
- 5. Who do you think the "rebels" are?

- 3. What did Jesus mean when He cried out, "It is finished."
